OUR KEY INITIATIVE IS NOW IN OPERATION.

Understand the Issue.

Spalding County has almost 5,000 veterans. 99%+ are typical productive citizens supporting their families and moving through life as we all do. Sadly, though, we have homeless veterans made so by a myriad of reasons. Our best estimate is between 100 and 130 homeless vets are Spalding County residents on any given day. They have served our country honorably and deserve a hand up. They, too, can have happy, satisfying lives and a positive future if only we make the commitment to help and give them that second chance.





Since its inception, the Griffin-Spalding Military Affairs Committee has provided financial support to numerous Veterans in the community who have various needs that could not be fulfilled by other sources. The committee works predominantly with the other Veterans groups in the community such as the American Legion, The Veterans of Foreign Wars, The Marine Corps League, and DSPII Waypoint, a veteran's support service.

But today, our committee is mobilizing forces in a new way.

Help support our initiative to renovate a local church campus into a homeless veteran transition center.

Our committee has recommended a solution and successfully lobbied Spalding County to take the bold step to help eradicate veteran homelessness within our community. The County has agreed to purchase and renovate The Hanleiter Methodist Church on West Broad Street in Griffin. This large campus features over 14,810 sq ft plus ample parking and recreational greenspace to serve veteran needs efficiently and effectively.







Initial plans call for The Sanctuary and Chapel to be freshened up for events and ceremonies. The Sunday School Building will be remodeled into veteran living quarters and counseling space. The goal is to provide veterans with what they need to subsist while undergoing the individual support programs they agree to when they processed into the program. DSPII Waypoint will consult on layout throughout the construction process and ultimately will operate the center to deliver their successful Veteran service model.

Bottom-line, when it opens in 2025, this facility will provide safe, temporary living space for homeless veterans while they:

- ➤ Undergo needed treatment or counseling
- ➤ Undertake Job-Skills training, if necessary, to get them re-connected to the community at large.
